11. Overview of learning and Instruction:

I. Face to face Session:

These will be conducted at the start of program. Each face to face session will be of 5 days. Attendance of students in Face to face **will be mandatory**.

Suitable venues will be identified depending upon the students' geographical representation. These sessions will be staggered and will be conducted as per the suitability of participants and NUMS faculty.

The online program will be launched at the same time for all participants.

During F2F sessions, Students will be oriented to the program and its implementation, introduction to Moodle and distance learning. Introduction of all four courses will be given and competencies will be defined and discussed

II. Distance learning:

Distance Learning will be using Moodle software, customized for the program, will be used by students and faculty for access to learning material, discussions and assessments of each course.

Distance Learning study groups (DLSGs):

Geographically diverse online study groups of students will be made. Each study group will be supervised and marked throughout the course by faculty from NUMS/constituent and affiliates (as assigned).

Internal assessments during the six weeks of each course will also be on the online portal.

• Overall planning and implementation of the program.

a. Course Directors (CD)–NUMS faculty:

- Developing course content and assessments
- Training and guiding the site coordinators and teaching assistants
- Conducting face to face sessions
- Compiling scores of continuous assessments and forwarding it to the University before the certification exam.

b. Program tutors – NUMS faculty/faculty from constituent and affiliates

- Monitoring student responses on dashboard
- Scoring students assignments, responses on discussion board and End-
- of-course (EOC) assessment, on guidelines provided by the program directors
- Conducting mandatory one virtual session per course for participants
